## Math

#### **Beginner:**


- Can you count to 10 in <u>Spanish</u> while singing?
- Tapas time! See if you can write what time each clock shows.
- Now is the perfect time of year for watermelons. Do you know how many halves are in 1 whole watermelon?

#### Intermediate:

- ¿Qué hora es? (What time is it?) Cut out the rectangles and then see if you can match the times in Spanish. Need a hint? Here's a handy translation guide.
- Practice <u>counting to 100</u> in Spanish, then play "5 in a Row" with a partner.
- If you invite 3 friends over for tapas and each person wants 2 to 3 different tapas dishes, how many dishes will you prepare? Use the menu on page 10 to plan your party.

#### **Advanced:**

- What's farther, a mile or a kilometer? Learn to <u>convert</u> kilometers to miles, then see if you can convert the distance between Madrid and Barcelona to <u>miles</u>.
- Have you ever heard of the <u>sheep parade</u>? See if you can solve the big kids question after learning how many miles they walk.
- Every year in Spain, people stack up to make a "<u>castell</u>." If you're in a 14-layer tower, and there are 3 more layers below you than above you, in which layer are you?







# Science & Geography

#### **Beginner:**

- What better way to learn the <u>regions of Spain</u> than with a catchy tune?
- Let's "sea" what kind of fun creatures live in and near the Mediterranean Sea.
- Ready to go hiking through **Garajonay National Park** in Spain?

#### Intermediate:

- Do you know which islands are part of Spain? Let's take a virtual tour.
- The <u>Iberian Lynx</u> is the most endangered cat in the world. See what wildlife rescuers in Spain are doing to help save this incredible creature.
- Grab your lab coat and snorkel. We're headed to the <u>Mediterranean Sea</u> to learn why researchers call it a mini science lab.

#### Advanced:

- Spain occupies most of the <u>Iberian Peninsula</u>. Check out what makes this area of the world so awesome.
- Pop quiz! Read through these facts about <u>Spain</u> and then click Start Activities to see how many questions you can answer.
- The <u>Pyrenees</u> is a mountain range that stretches between France and Spain. Let's take a look from space!







## **Languages & Literature**

#### **Beginner:**

- Have you ever read "The Very Hungry Caterpillar"? Let's listen to it in Spanish.
- Repeat after me! Learn how to <u>pronounce</u> these yummy Spanish foods.
- In Spanish, the term for "school" is escuela (lah es-QUAIL-ah). How many times do you hear escuela in this <u>sona</u>?

#### Intermediate:

- Hola! How do you let someone know if you like or dislike certain foods in **Spanish**?
- Got a second? Use the words on the right to learn Spanish words about time.
- Did you know that Spanish spoken in Spain is slightly different from <u>Spanish</u> in Latin America?

#### Advanced:

- Do you know what languages people spoke in Spain before <u>Spanish</u> was even a language?
- <u>Ustedes vs. Vosotros!</u> Do you know when to use which one?
- This mysterious language is making a comeback in parts of Spain. Any quesses?

#### Writing prompt:

 According to legend, Spanish explorer Ponce de Leon traveled from Spain to Florida in search of the Fountain of Youth. Instead, he discovered giant sea turtles. Write about a time when things turned out differently than you expected. Were you happy or disappointed with the results?





# **History & Culture**

#### **Beginner:**

- Get your dancing shoes on! We're headed to Sesame Street to learn Flamenco.
- Pa-pa-pa paella! Sing along while making a famous dish from Spain.
- Food fight! Check out the world's largest food fight in Spain called <u>La Tomatina</u>.

#### Intermediate:

- Ever wonder what life is like for kids in **Spain**?
- In Valencia, Spain, there is a very specific way to make <u>paella</u>. Let's see if we can identify paella Valenciana.
- Cold soup hits the spot on a hot day in Spain. Let's see what makes <u>gazpacho and</u> <u>salmorejo</u> so tasty.

#### **Advanced:**

- Every August, Spain throws a festival that features an epic tomato food fight! What other <u>incredible festivals</u> happen around the world?
- Cocoa trees (where chocolate comes from!) grow mostly close to the equator, but do you know what significant change was made to <u>chocolate</u> when it was brought to Spain in 1528?
- It's OK to put your own spin on a traditional recipe, but it's still fun to know how to make the authentic version. Let's look at <u>paella</u>, for example.

#### **Creative Exercise**

Use your imagination and art supplies to make a tourist guide to a city or area in Spain. What should people visit and why?





# **Arts & Crafts**

#### **Beginner:**

- These silly tomatoes are making funny faces. See if you can follow along to draw them.
- Now grab your <u>playdough</u> for more tomato shaping fun!
- Go team! Follow the numbers guide to bring <u>color</u> to this popular sport in Spain.

#### Intermediate:

- Check out this fun watercolor trick while practicing Spanish.
- If you think drawing a tomato is easy, try drawing a tomato slice.
- Make your own *abanico* (fan) and learn to dance flamenco with it!

#### **Advanced:**

- <u>Marionettes</u> are string puppets that are a playful part of Spain's history. Try making your own puppet pup and put on a "pawfect" show.
- Brush up on your <u>Picasso</u> history and then try making your own <u>two-face art</u>.
- Ready for a drawing challenge? See if you can follow along to make the Spain national football team logo.







# **Field Trips**

- Time to get up, stretch, and learn the <u>flamenco dance</u> of Spain!
- We're off to the <u>Canary Islands</u> to do hands-on lizard research!
- <u>Saffron</u> is a special spice sometimes used to make Spanish dishes like paella. Let's go to India and see how this rare flower is grown.
