Intro

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## Math

## Intermediate:

- Can you help the penguin get to an ice cream cone? Each level is a new puzzle.


## Advanced:

- Check out these monstrous milkshakes and see if you can solve the last challenge question.
- Game time! Push play to multiply, scoop, and keep your customers happy.
- The math in this fast-paced ice cream game may not be difficult, but can you keep up?



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## Science \& Geography

## Beginner:

## Intermediate:
