Math

Beginner:


- Brr! Is it cold where you live? Check out how cold the <u>temperatures</u> drop in Sweden during winter.
- Did you know Legos® were invented in Denmark? Let's have some fun <u>adding</u> up these Lego® characters.
- Now see if you can <u>subtract</u> the Lego® characters.

Intermediate:

- What kind of currency do they use in Scandinavia? See if you can add <u>Norwegian coins</u> called krona.
- Now see if you can count these bills from Denmark.
- Bundle up! Watch this <u>short video</u> on converting Farenheit to Celcius, then challenge yourself with these hot and cold <u>questions</u>.

Advanced:

- Fun fact time! Let's find out where the <u>Swedish currency</u> called krona comes from.
- If you have \$50 U.S. dollars (USD), how much is that in Swedish krong (SEK)?
- Ski jumping is not only a common sport in Norway, it's also a mathematical sport.







Science & Geography

Beginner:

- Have you ever heard of the northern lights?
- Let's take a cruise through Sweden's thousands of tiny islands.
- Norway is known for its fjords, but what exactly is a fjord?

Intermediate:

- Why is Sweden's Arctic north called "the land of the midnight sun"?
- Do you know what Norway's coastline is famous for?
- In <u>Denmark</u>, can you guess how many people live in the capital city Copenhagen?

Advanced:

- Scandinavia is an ideal place to see the <u>northern lights</u>. Ever wonder what causes these dancing lights to appear?
- What's the difference between Scandinavia and the Nordic countries?
- Curling is a popular sport in Scandinavia. Check out the <u>physics</u> involved in moving a granite stone across the ice.







Languages & Literature

Beginner:

- Do you think you can pronounce these numbers in **Swedish**?
- The Vikings from Scandinavia may have had a sweet side. Let's read <u>Viking in Love</u> by Doug Cenko.
- Now let's go on a great quest to find the <u>northern lights</u> in this storytime read aloud.

Intermediate:

- Some of your favorite stories may have been written by this <u>famous author</u> from Denmark.
- "Hej hej!" Let's check out the many ways to say "hello" in Swedish.
- Great job! Now let's try, "How are you?"

Advanced:

- Does everyone in Scandinavia speak the same language? Nope! The languages may be different but they are all considered <u>North Germanic languages</u>.
- When you read the names of your favorite Swedish foods, you may notice a few extra symbols. Here's a helpful <u>pronunciation guide</u>.
- The word "hygge" embodies Danish culture, but do you know where this word originated?

Writing prompt:

· Write a poem about seeing snow for the first time, even if you've never seen it!





History & Culture

Beginner:

- Vikings, fairy tales, and pastries! Let's explore the culture in <u>Denmark</u>.
- Wait, did someone say Vikings?
- What does the word <u>Viking</u> mean anyway?

Intermediate:

- Did you know that Denmark and Norway used to be a single place called <u>Denmark-Norway</u>?
- Bread, potatoes, and buttery porridge let's explore what many <u>Norwegians</u> typically eat.
- Now let's go with Gordon Ramsay to Norway to see how Norwegian food has been influenced by the <u>Sami people</u>.

Advanced:

- Why are Danes so obsessed with Smørrebrød?
- Uh oh, are <u>Swedish meatballs</u> actually from Sweden?
- This mouthwatering video shows the secret of the <u>Danish pastry</u> called the "Spandauer," which is found in almost every Danish bakery in the world.
