Math

Beginner:


- Ahoy, matey! Practice problem solving to see if you can wake the sleeping elephant pirate.
- How many coins did the pirate find? Let's try a fun gold coin counting activity.
- Wonder how pirates <u>measured</u> distance without rulers?

Intermediate:

- Let's play Place Value Pirates! Argh!
- Add the coins to see how much treasure you have.
- Imagine if 30 pirates train their parrot to talk, and 1/2 of them get their parrot to say "Ahoy!" How many parrots learn to say "Ahoy!"?

Advanced:

- See if you can find or guess the correct <u>percentage</u> in this fun pirate game.
- Before you set sail, write the coordinates of the objects on this treasure map.
- Now it's your turn to map the seas!







Science & Geography

Beginner:

- Grab your compass! We're learning how to read a treasure map.
- Let's go on a fizzy pirate treasure hunt. First, we need to make our treasure.
- Ever wonder why pirates wear eye patches?

Intermediate:

- Take a trip to the <u>Caribbean</u> to learn about island life.
- With all that water around, it's good to know how to waterproof your coins.
- Computers might be great at making maps, but we need to give them directions first. Discover how to <u>code a treasure map</u> by hand!

Advanced:

- Did pirates only sail in the Caribbean? Check out these 10 facts about pirates.
- Don't be fooled! Learn the difference between real gold and fool's gold.
- Ready to make waves? Make your own ocean in a bottle.







Languages & Literature

Beginner:

- Say please! It's important even for pirates to be polite. Let's read along with <u>Are Pirates Polite</u>? by Corinne Demas and Artemis Roehrig.
- What are all the other kids cooking up for their pirate party? Find out in this fun animated story.
- Ahoy! Let's talk like pirates today!

Intermediate:

- Think you know the pirate lingo? Try unscrambling these fun pirate terms.
- Can you find the famous pirate names in this challenging word search?
- Is a pirate's life for you? See if you can answer the comprehension questions after reading this <u>pirate passage</u>.

Advanced:

- These pirates have a secret message for you! Can you solve the <u>crossword puzzle</u>?
- Ready, set, read! Review the <u>historical adventures</u> of pirates, then see how quickly you can answer the questions that follow.
- Ahoy, matey! Write a conversation between two pirates using these <u>pirate words</u> and phrases.

Writing prompt:

• Imagine if pirates from the 1700s were alive today. Write about a day in the life of a pirate in modern society.





History & Culture

Beginner:

- Are ye ready to learn the truth about <u>pirates in history</u>?
- Do you think pirates really <u>buried treasure</u>?
- Where did pirates come from anyway? The talented Mr. Q explains.

Intermediate:

- Get to know the most <u>famous pirates</u> of all time!
- Treasure hunting time! Check out the artifacts uncovered from a real <u>pirate shipwreck</u>.
- In fact, some shipwreck sites have reef systems that actually help the habitat.

Advanced:

- This month we made Caribbean-Style Jerk Chicken, but do you ever wonder why we call it "jerk" chicken?
- Land ho! Click through the <u>interactive map</u> to learn about the historical adventures of pirates in the Caribbean.
- Pirates didn't always have it easy. In this Ted Talk, <u>Tom Nash</u> may not be a real pirate, but he knows what it's like to overcome adversity.

Arts & Crafts

Beginner:

- Argh! Make your own pirate flag to hang for your next pirate party!
- It's not a pirate party without pirate hats!

Intermediate:

- In this fun game, you get to craft your own treasure map!
- Grab your crayons and follow along to <u>draw Polly</u> the parrot.
- Okay mateys, it's time to transform a medium delivery box into a mighty pirate ship!

Advanced:

- Don't get lost at sea! Learn to make your own compass.
- Scan the open waters for other ships using your DIY <u>refracting telescope</u>.
- Arrr ye ready for a challenge? Try your hand at folding this decorative pirate ship.

- Ready for an <u>adventure</u> with Miss Penny? We're off to explore a pirate ship, read a treasure map, and fight for the key to the treasure chest!
