## Math

## Beginner:

## Intermediate:

- Guess how many cookies are on the table (without counting each one).
- Uh oh, you need twice as many cookies as this recipe makes. Rewrite the recipe to make the amount you need.
- Before slicing up your rugelach dough, freshen up on fractions.


## Advanced:

- How fast do you think a grasshopper could eat a cookie?
- Holiday cooking involves a lot of fractions. Can you solve these cooking word problems?
- A recipe for cookies calls for 3 1/4 cups of sugar, but 3 1/9 cups was already added. Here's how to write a one-step equation to solve the problem.
